RESULTS 1974 ARRL FIELD DAY

With just three stations on the air covering 80 cw, 40 cw, 40 ssb, 20 ssb, and 15 ssb, the field day folks managed to log in 61 sections, 40 states plus VE1, 4, 5, and 7, a HI8, and a KW6. Contacts totaled 418 for a claimed score of 984, this includes the fifty points credited for a 30 minute radio program taped by four club members and aired by station KDON at 8:15 am Sunday June 23.

While not the best show of people and participation that the club has had, things did go along quite smoothly some preliminary hastle, such as procuring a generator for power.
