Speaker and guest for the evening will be Lance Wilson WA6QXF, who is currently in the midst of one of his many projects, but will take time out to give the members a talk on UHF and some associated equipment.

FIELD DAY RESULTS

The Santa Cruz K6BJ group gathered as planned early Saturday morning last June 26th, first task was to get the generator set up and running, then with the aid of a casting rod, a bow and arrow, and a saftey belt proceeded to set up various configurations of antennas for the 80, 40, 20, 15 and 2 meter bands.

FCC LICENSE CHANGES

Effective July 23, 1976 technicians will have all novice privileges, that is cw on 80, 40, 15, and 10 meters novice segments. Those holding conditional licenses will be grandfathered into regular licenses, that is they will become generals and those techs who got theirs mail order will become full techs with full credit for the passed elements when going for the higher grade lic-

Novices get a break also, although the license period is to remain for two years the one year waiting period to take the novice test again is waived. Maximum for novices will go to 250 watts from the present 75, the 250 watts will apply to all stations working in the novice segments regarless of class of license.

This FCC action also eliminated all further volunteer exam licenses except the novice.

CALIFORNIAS AB 4271

Last months SHORT SKIP was urging all to write their congressman regarding this bill as it would have put "Ham" plates in the vanity category with the

associated higher fees.

Through the efforts of the many Ham clubs spearheaded by the Marin Amateur Rsdio Club and the many letters from the states Amateurs, prompted Assembly—man Micheal Wornum, author of the bill to specifically exempt Amateur plates from the "vanity" classification. Assemblyman Wornum went even further by sending letters to all the members of the legislature explaining his change.
